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About Jeevodaya

Jeevodaya, established in 1999 as a non-profit organization, is unwaveringly dedicated to addressing the plight of children living in precarious circumstances around railway stations, including runaways and missing children. This noble initiative strives to provide these vulnerable youths with fundamental necessities such as food, shelter, and education. The transformation of Itarsi into a more child-friendly railway station commenced in 1999, initiated by Sr. Clara, a member of the sisters of St. Joseph of Chambery, who laid the foundation for the Jeevodaya society.

Over the past two decades, Jeevodaya's compassionate outreach has positively impacted more than 53000 children, guiding them towards a secure and dignified life. This commendable effort involves reuniting them with their families, providing rehabilitation, vocational training, and facilitating job placement. Jeevodaya recognizes the urgency of timely intervention, as these children are at risk of falling into dire circumstances such as begging, child labor, engagement in anti-social activities, and human trafficking for exploitative purposes. Additionally, these children are deprived of the joys of childhood and opportunities for holistic development.

In response to these pressing concerns, Jeevodaya strategically extended its operations to Itarsi. A temporary shelter home for children in need of care and protection was established in collaboration with the West Central Railway

Women's Welfare Organization. Moreover, long-term shelters for both girls and boys were established with generous support from donors and congregations. Jeevodaya is deeply committed to ensuring that these children receive not only education but also vocational training, along with the care and affection they need, up to the age of 18. Furthermore, the organization provides support to young adults above the age of 18 through vocational and job placement and higher education programs.

In 2022, Jeevodaya celebrated a significant milestone, marking 22 years of its remarkable journey that commenced on the railway platforms of Itarsi railway station. It has evolved into a commendable effort to provide high-quality residential facilities and comprehensive programs for the holistic rehabilitation of rescued children.

The organization's goal is oriented toward establishing quality care homes, adopting a child-friendly approach in society, practicing child rights in duty bearers, and ensuring sustainable living standards for children in the future.

After 23 years of operation, there is a strong focus on livelihood orientation, with a large number of children successfully working and some even starting their own businesses. Notably, one of our Alumni Mr. Arjun Thakur achieved the distinction of becoming a part of the Indian Army, a source of immense satisfaction for Jeevodaya.

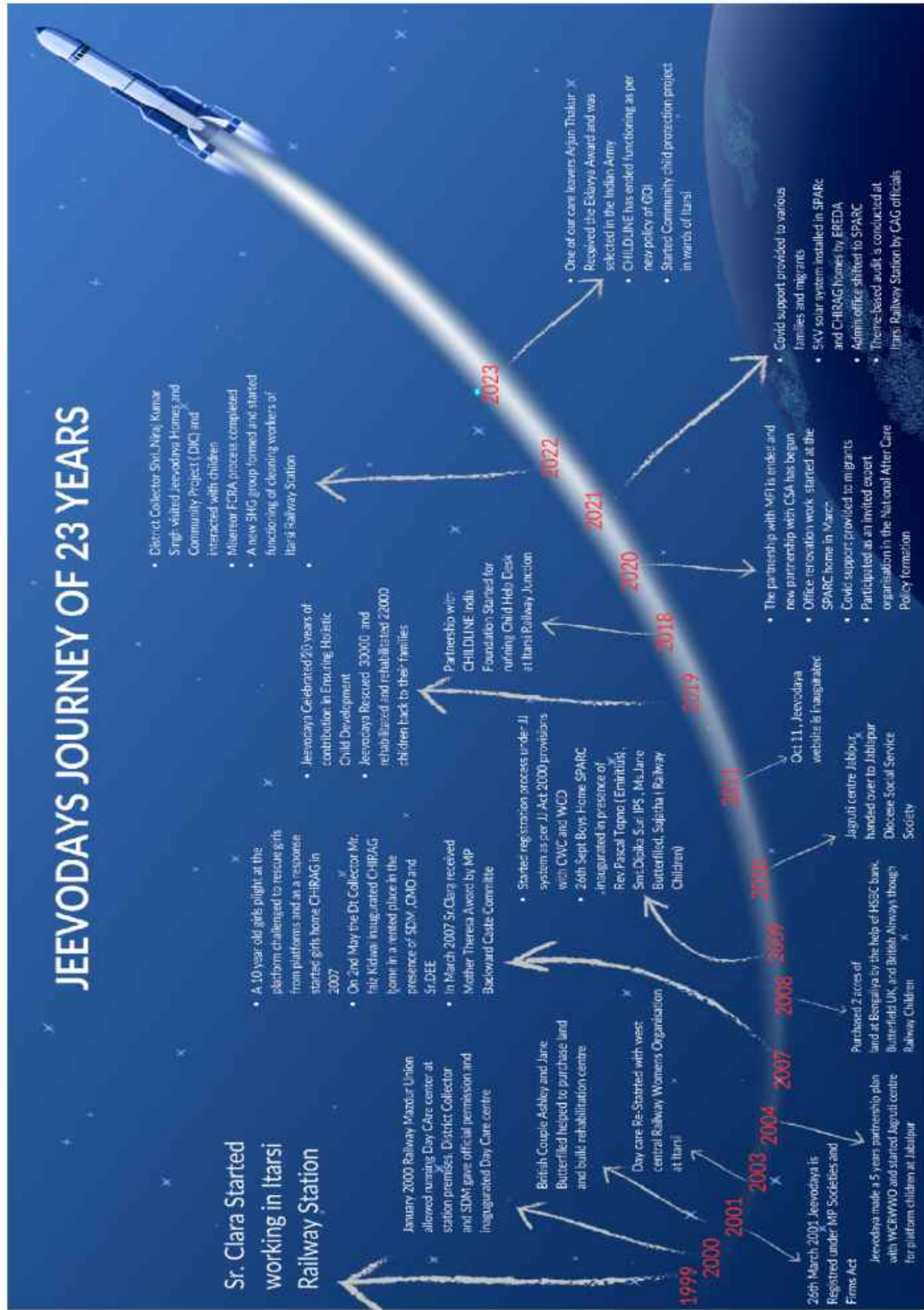

Achievements & Milestones

Children reached out through Outreach Service:

In the year 2022-2023 1440 children from Itarsi Railway Junction of West Central Railway Zone of Indian Railway. And we have rescued 189 children under various circumstances. among them 75 children had been reunified with their families and other children are sent to CCIs for the further processes. Follow ups for the rehabilitated children are carried out by Jeevodaya Childline team members on regular intervals to ensure the wellbeing of these children.

Publication and release of Jeevodaya Annual report 2021-22

It was on Jeevodaya Annual Day Celebration, release of Jeevodaya annual report.2021-22 by Honorable Shri Neeraj Kumar Singh IAS (Collector - Narmadapuram) on 19th November, 2022 in the presence of guests, well-wishers, Children, and staff of Jeevodaya. Mr. Shri Girish Sharma IAS (Secretary - General Administration Govt of MP) was the guest of honor at the event; children presented various programs during the annual day .

CHILDLINE se Dosti Campaign:

Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE celebrated CHILDLINE Se Dosti Campaign on the day of universal Children Day on 14th November, 2022 at Itarsi Railway station and in both children homes. The children from Jeevodaya children home together staff were part of the campaign. The team provided awareness on child rights to Government Stakeholder such as Railway Station superintendent, Deputy Station superintends, Inspector - RPF, Inspector- GRP, Army- military officials, Itarsi local police station and non govt. Stakeholders like coolie, vendors, shop keepers, youth, and railway passengers from Itarsi railway station were part of the campaign. It was one of the major sensitization programs held with support of children, staff, and stakeholders.

Monitoring visits by Govt. officials to Jeevodaya:

Govt.systems take ownership in the protection of children as per the directions from the High

Court and government ministries in central and state government. As result, Government officials visit/monitoring are regular in Jeevodaya homes esp. ICPS officials, CWC, District judges, Addl District Judge, Principal Magistrate of JJB, District and state level Women & child department officials etc. .

CHILD Help Group Meetings:

As per the Railway SOP, CHILD Help Group was formed in the Itarsi Railway Junction under the aegis of Station Superintendent. Inspector RPF, SSO, GRP, CTI and Jeevodaya is a part of the group. In the period of April 2022 to March 2023 there are 03 CHG meetings were organized, in these meetings we have initiated many discussions related to child safety and protection related to Railway Station. Many of the issues such as child friendly space, impress money, Station awareness systems etc. were successfully sorted out and we have also contacted DRM office for the same .

Child rights and Child Protection Trainings in Schools :

Jeevodaya has Sensitized around 523 children and 42 teachers on the Safety & Protection through Good touch and Bad touch Sessions in various schools in Itarsi. Also, we provide psychological and counselling support to children who are in need and identified through these sessions

22nd. Annual day celebration of Jeevodaya :

We celebrated our 22nd. Annual day with Children, older children/youth, Government stakeholders, guests and well-wishers and staff on 19th November 2022 . The event was organized in Chirag home premises and the inauguration was done by Mr. Neeraj Kumar Singh, IAS (District Collector – Narmadapuram). The chief guest was Shri Girish Sharma IAS (Secretary in Mantralay - Govt of MP).

Health & Hygiene :

The newly appointed para medical staff lead regular health check-ups and children who are identified in need of further treatment are given treatments in hospitals and in other referral

services. HB testing is done on a quarterly basis and the children who are with low HB are given special diet food to improve their HB. General ENT is conducted for all children with the help of Govt Hospital Itarsi, and further treatment is suggested for few children. For children who needs special treatments will be taken to Narmadapuram or to Bhopal by Para Medical staff and provided support.

Child Participation :

Children are given the opportunity to share their views and chance to participate in the regular activities of their homes through children's committees. The regular activities are planned and discussed in children's committees once a month and their suggestions will be considered appropriately . Also, the Man Ki Bat is also another platform where children share their thoughts and feelings once a month with management representatives , after the suggestions and sharing will be discussed with home team too for appropriate actions . In most of the activities we promote children's participation to have a democratic and positive atmosphere where they can grow more by participating themselves .

Education :

All children who are permanently placed in both homes are sent to regular this Year shifted Boys to CM Raise School and Girls to PM Shri School. In the reporting year children shown good performance in their academics from the schools. Also, we provide extra tuition support through 2 tuition teachers on both homes for the support of children. Weaker children are given extra time and support for the studies. The library and computer lab also plays a vital role in the children's education. In the coming year, we are aiming to link with NIIT foundation for providing computer courses to children with certifications .

Extra-Curricular activities :

Celebrations like Raksha Bandhan, Independence Day, Dahi Handi, Diwali, Christmas, Annual day celebrations and Celebrations of Birthdays were occasions, we celebrate time to time . Also, our children participate in various competitions at district and state levels (sports and art) through their schools' time to time. As part of summer camp

children specially engage in various art and craft making, painting, garden development etc.

Trainings and Capacity building programs :

Training and Capacity building of children and staff is one area we focus regularly. Life Skill Education Sessions and sessions related to health , hygiene, moral growth , personality development , Child protection , Laws and Acts , Technical Growth etc. were organized time to time for all children and staff . Through these sessions children and staff are given a chance to enhance their capacity and skills in various topics .

Advocacy Meetings and Initiatives :

Jeevodaya is actively participating in JJB review Monthly meetings at Narmadapuram under the aegis of Principal Magistrate, District Court in respect to implementation of Juvenile Justice Act, 2015 and Childcare institutions functioning.

Also, another platform for giving feedback and sharing concerns are monthly review meetings of District Collector . We are a regular part of such meetings and continuously share concerns and feedbacks over child related issues .As a result of sharing such concern, the district collector has taken many initiatives in Itarsi such as education facility for rag picking children , rehabilitation of families stayed at Itarsi railway station etc.

Stakeholder Training programs :

Through Jeevodaya Railway Childline, we organize training and capacity building programs for various stakeholders such as Police, GRP, RPF ,Railway officials Anganwadi workers etc. on child protection and care . In the reporting year we organized 05 such training in which we provide knowledge about child rights , protection, and role of various stakeholders . Mostly our team members take the sessions, and we involve the experts and resource people for such sessions .

Special mention about Arjun Thakur :

Arjun one of our care leavers who performs outstandingly in sports (Shooting) recently selected in India Army as a Havildar, currently he is under training in army training center

Mhow, Indore. Also, he has been nominated for the Ekalavya Award of state of Madhya Pradesh for his excellence in sports. He has been a good performer and a role model for the remaining children in achieving goals and excellence .

Children Education Details :

All the permanent children are attending regular schools from class 2nd to 12th . Since last year, children are going to government schools (CM Rise Schools) PM Shri School since the education and extracurricular facilities are far better from private schools. In last year's annual board exams Jarina Riya Scored 71.40% as highest from girls and Shyam Savarkar Scored 89.90% highest from Boys.

After Care Programs :

We support the care leavers - youth after leaving the institution in collaboration with Government after care homes and Catalyst for Social Action (CSA) . We placed 7 children (2 from Sparc and 5 from Chirag) in last year in after care services. We have focused preparation programs for the children from 16 year onwards to enable them for the outer world and living independently, which includes career counselling , financial literacy and orientation in activities related to purchasing, documentation etc.

Alumni Engagements :

Children who go out from homes in after care program or handed over to their family will be joined to the Jeevodaya Alumni whatsapp group. The Alumni group is coordinated by the youth, and they coordinate with us for the meetings and other necessary communications. Currently we have 72 youth actively attached to the alumni community. We organize meetings with alumni youth 2 times a year as a gathering and for sharing their experiences with life . From last year's meeting , we have collected their suggestions regarding the support required in after care phase and submitted them to the state government. As a result of the same the state government of Madhya Pradesh has increased the after-care support from Rs.2000 to Rs.5000 which is a huge support for the children.

Exposure Visit to Bhopal :

As a part of the summer camp activities, we

have also planned 3 days outing for children in Bhopal. In every year, we organize such exposure visits with children for exploring new places and enjoy outing in new places. We have selected Bhopal this year, as it has many interesting places and organisations are there. It was fun, interesting, and exciting 03 days we spent in Bhopal. There were 72 people, 8 staff and 54 children in the group . The main places we visited were state tribal museum , Van Vihar, Saurya Smarak , DB City Mall, Fun City Water Park, Science Centre and Birla Mandir.

Summer Camp :

Summer camp for children is organised every year with an objective of enhancing the children mental and physical abilities with new knowledge and explorations. The camp is included with various activities and targeted product plans so that children's can plan, share and achieve their goals through the activities of the camp. The camp also ensured participation of each child at various levels from planning to implementation, it also helps children to improve their skills and give a space for sharing their thoughts. We have prepared separate exhibition of articles and materials made by boys and girls separately, the exhibition was inaugurated by the Principal Magistrate, JJB, Narmada Puram along with CWC members and other guests. The guests were excited to see the materials and article made by children and children explained about the materials and articles they made. After the exhibition is watched, the guests interacted with children about the experience in the summer camp. Children were happy to share their experiences of the camp and activities. Sr. Clara also shared her thoughts about the camp and its objectives as an address note to everyone.

Eco Spirituality :

We promote ecofriendly patterns of behaviour in all our programs and activities and teach children to be gentle while preserving and nurturing Nature. By promoting this motto, we include various activities like Interconnectedness - everything in nature is interconnected, Reverence for Nature, Stewardship and Sustainability, Ritual and Ceremony to remember and honour eco systems and its importance in life

Ram is now poised for a promising future, exemplifying the positive outcomes that result from tailored support and a commitment to empowering individuals to achieve their vocational and educational aspirations.



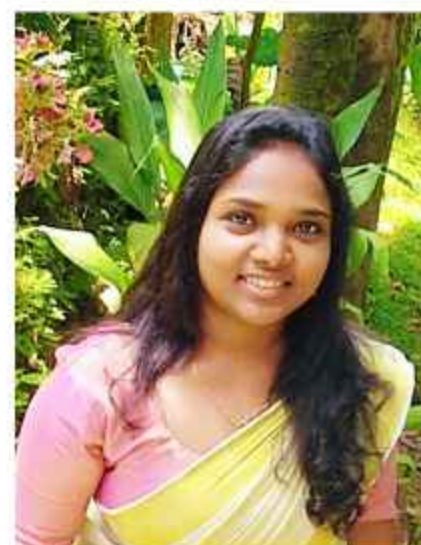
Internship Experience: Exploring Mental Health in Child Care at Sparc

Case Studies

No. 1

Introduction: In a commendable effort, the GRP Police of Itarsi, District Narmadapuram, rescued a 13-year-old child under circumstances warranting immediate attention. After collecting basic details and recognizing the need for further care, the GRP Police took proactive steps to ensure the child's safety and well-being.

Rescue and Initial Care: On the night of 07/07/23 at 9:25 PM, the GRP Police brought the child to Sparc Home for a night stay due to the late hour. This temporary arrangement allowed for essential care while preparations were made for a more comprehensive response.

Medical Examination and Legal Procedures: The following day, the GRP Police returned to Sparc Home and facilitated the child's medical examination at a hospital. Subsequently, adhering to all legal procedures, the child was presented before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC). Following due diligence, the GRP Police entrusted the child to the care of Jeevodaya Sparc Boys Home.

Collaborative Efforts and Counselling: Efforts were not limited to physical care; a social worker engaged in counselling sessions with the child. The information gleaned from these sessions prompted collaboration with the City CHILDLINE Bhopal team. Through their diligent efforts, the child's family was identified, and contact details were obtained.

Family Reconnection: Communication with the child's family was established, and a heartfelt conversation took place. Verification with the Asbagh Bhopal police station confirmed that a missing person FIR for the child had been filed. In coordination with the police, plans were made for the child's safe return to his family.

Custody Handover and Joyful Reunion: After thorough follow-up and coordination with the CWC Narmadapuram, the police, accompanied by the child's mother, arrived to take custody of the child. On 12/07/2023, in the presence of the CWC, the child was handed over to the police for the reunion with his family. The child and his mother expressed immense joy at being reunited.

Conclusion: This case exemplifies the effectiveness of collaborative efforts between the GRP Police, Sparc Home, City CHILDLINE Bhopal, and the diligent social worker. Through a systematic approach involving legal procedures, counselling, and coordination with relevant authorities, the child was successfully reintegrated with his family, ensuring his safety and well-being. This success underscores the importance of a unified and coordinated response in cases of child rescue and reunification. Successful Family Reintegration of a 12-Year-Old Rescued Child

No. 2

Introduction: In a significant intervention by the GRP Police Pipriya District, Narmadapuram, a 12-year-old child was rescued and subsequently entrusted to Jeevodaya Sparc Boys Home. The comprehensive efforts to address the child's situation involved legal procedures, medical examinations, and eventual placement in a Child Care Institution (CCI).

Rescue and Initial Care: The GRP Police engaged in dialogue with the child after the rescue, collecting essential details before proceeding with a thorough medical examination. Following the established legal procedures, the child was presented before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and subsequently handed over to Jeevodaya Sparc Boys Home.

Adjustment in CCI and Counselling: After a brief period of 3-4 days, the child was integrated into the CCI, where a social worker conducted counselling sessions. During these sessions, the child revealed a distressing narrative, citing physical abuse by his mother as the reason for leaving home. He disclosed his journey to Pipriya Railway station after escaping his troubled home.

Family Search and Communication: Efforts to locate the child's family were initiated, involving the social worker contacting City CHILDLINE Jabalpur. The Jabalpur CHILDLINE team conducted a thorough search for the child's home, gathering documents and contact details. Subsequent communication with the family took place, allowing the child to reconnect with them over the phone.

Challenges in Family Reintegration: Despite efforts to facilitate the child's return home, the family hesitated due to the child's history of running away multiple times. The CWC Narmadapuram suggested the family come to collect the child, but they were reluctant.

Health Challenges and Convincing the Family: The child's health deteriorated, experiencing frequent epileptic seizures. Medical treatment at the civil hospital in Itarsi did not yield significant improvement. Desperate to address the child's condition, the home staff contacted the family, who shared details about the required medication. Despite purchasing and administering the prescribed tablets, the child's health did not show improvement.

Family Reintegration and Follow-up: Convinced of the necessity for the family's physical presence, the family was persuaded to come to Narmadapuram. In front of the CWC, the family was granted custody of the child on 14/09/2023. Follow-up efforts confirmed the child's safe return home, marking the resolution of a complex case involving medical challenges and familial hesitations.

This case highlights the intricate challenges in the rescue and reintegration process, emphasizing the importance of addressing both the physical and emotional well-being of the child. The collaborative efforts of law enforcement, child care institutions, and medical professionals ultimately led to the successful reunification of the child with his family.

Case Studies

No. 3

Introduction: In November 2017, our intervention team rescued Manya, a 9-year-old girl, from hazardous conditions where she was engaged in the sale of pouches and tobacco alongside her mother. Recognizing the urgency of the situation, immediate steps were taken to ensure Manya's safety and well-being due to her exposure to tobacco addiction and precarious living conditions.

Intervention and Admission to Jeevodaya Society: Upon rescue, Manya was presented before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC), which subsequently admitted her to Jeevodaya Society. The primary focus of the intervention was to address Manya's tobacco addiction through a combination of medical assistance and counseling. Concurrently, efforts were made to counsel her mother, underscoring the safety and educational opportunities available to Manya within the supportive framework of Jeevodaya Society.

Challenges in the Family Environment: Manya's mother, residing in precarious conditions on railway platforms with her stepfather, had been exploiting Manya for financial gains. The mother's struggles with alcohol exacerbated concerns about Manya's safety and well-being in her familial environment.

Family Reintegration: In June 2023, a pivotal moment in Manya's life unfolded when her elder sister, now married, expressed a genuine interest in bringing her home. The Jeevodaya team conducted comprehensive assessments, including a visit to the real father's home, to ensure a safe and nurturing environment for Manya.

Successful Home Placement: Following assurances from Manya's father and married sister regarding her care and education, a decision was made to reintegrate Manya with her biological family. The meticulous home placement process was executed, and Manya seamlessly transitioned to living with her sister.

Current Status: Manya is currently thriving in her new family environment. Enrolled in the 9th grade, she actively engages in her studies, demonstrating remarkable progress. The improved circumstances and the unwavering support of her family have significantly contributed to her overall well-being and happiness.

This case study exemplifies the successful collaboration between intervention agencies, the legal system, and the rehabilitative efforts of Jeevodaya Society, resulting in Manya's triumphant journey towards rehabilitation and family reintegration.

No. 4

Introduction: Reema, a resilient 10-year-old girl, endured a life marked by vulnerability, residing with her biological mother and stepfather. The gravity of her situation escalated when she became a victim of both physical and mental abuse at the hands of her stepfather. Despite the adversities, Reema's courage prevailed, and she reached out for help from her Anganwadi supervisor. Recognizing the urgency of the situation, the supervisor promptly contacted Child Line members.

Rescue and Rehabilitation at Jeevodaya: Following her rescue in September 2020, Reema found refuge in Jeevodaya, a shelter that provided her with comprehensive support, including medical assistance, education, and counseling. Starting her educational journey from the second grade, Reema, who had never attended school before, eagerly embraced the opportunity for learning.

Holistic Rehabilitation: The dedicated team at Jeevodaya went beyond immediate care and focused on the holistic rehabilitation of Reema. Uncovering crucial information about Reema's real father, the team engaged in tireless efforts to locate him. Overcoming challenges in finding his address and contact details, they successfully established contact. Reema's father, upon understanding the situation, expressed a heartfelt willingness to reintegrate her into the family.

Family Reintegration: In June 2023, a moment of joy unfolded as Reema joyfully reintegrated with her biological father and brothers. The reintegration process marked a significant transformation in her life. Now attending school daily, Reema radiates happiness in her family, showcasing a remarkable journey from the hardships she faced earlier in her young life.

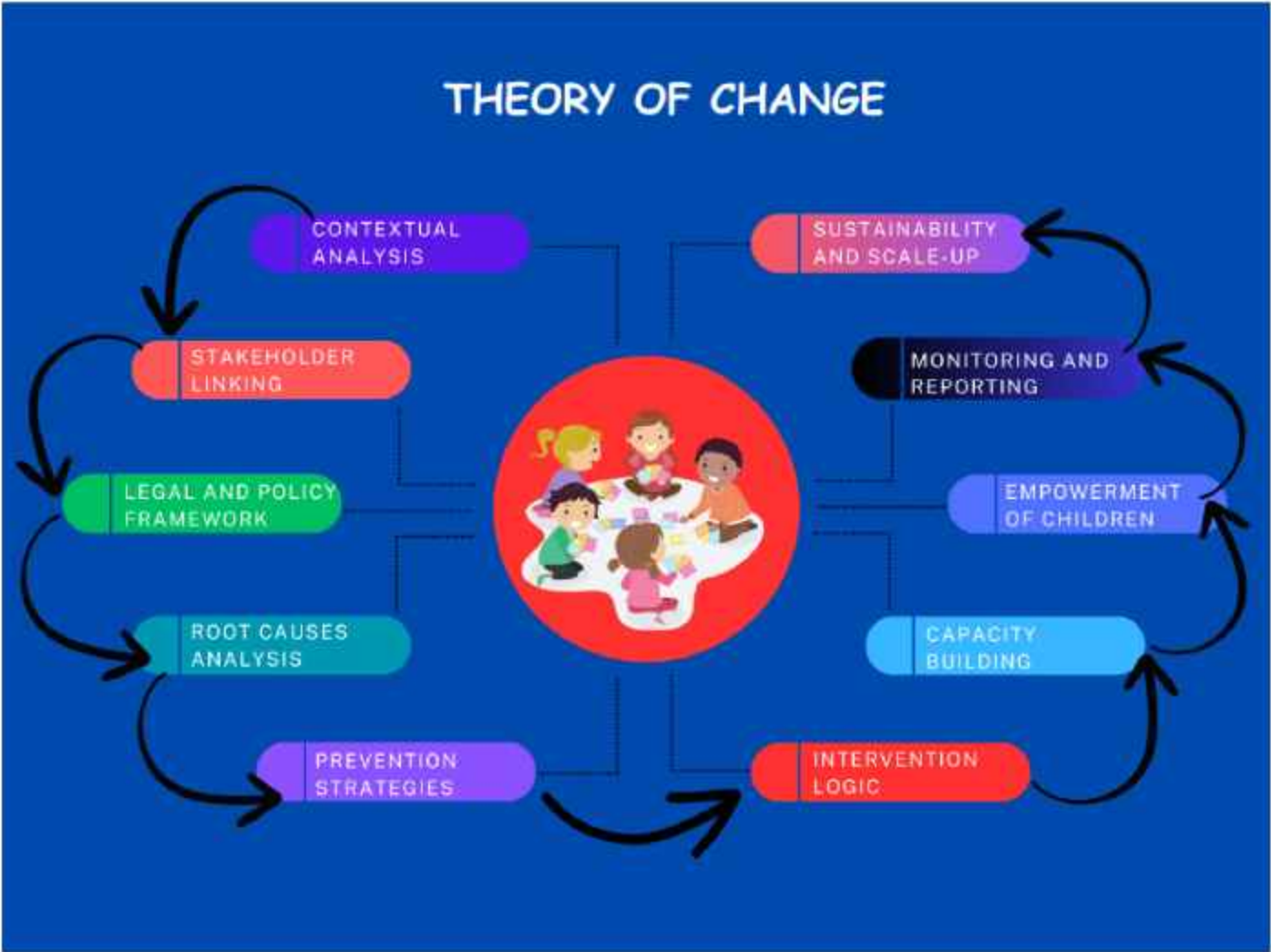
